7.4 HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION: The newly independent states faced political and economic struggles under the Articles of Confederation. These challenges resulted in a Constitutional Convention, a debate over ratification, and the eventual adoption of the Bill of Rights. (Standards: 1, 5; Themes: GOV, CIV)

7.4a Throughout the American Revolution, the colonies struggled to address their differing social, political, and economic interests and to establish unity. The Articles of Confederation created a form of government that loosely united the states, but allowed states to maintain a large degree of sovereignty.

Objective: After participating in a brainstorming activity to analyze the importance of compromise through the conflict between Hamilton and Burr, students will compare different factors that ultimately resulted in the Great Compromise by taking a Quizizz and relating the concept of compromise to how it is needed in today's society.

• Students will watch a clip from the television show, <i>The Blg Ba</i> . <i>Theory</i> , as an introduction to the topic of compromise.

Students will watch a clip from the television show, <i>The Big Bang Theory</i>, as an introduction to the topic of compromise. Using the PowerPoint, students will analyze the importance of compromise through the conflict of Alexander Hamilton and Aaron Burr. Students will continue reading through the PowerPoint slides to gather information about The Great Compromise. Students will do a quiz using Quizizz to review the important concepts of The Great Compromise. Students will watch the video on the Constitutional Convention to view a summary of the Great Compromise and a preview of the other compromises made during the Constitutional Convention. As independent practice, students will watch the news and identify two groups that need to compromise in order for society to move forward.
